But He gave power to As many as received Him To become the children of God For those who believe in His name Which were not born of flesh and blood Or of man's desire or man's will but of God

And the Word was made flesh And lived among us while

- 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- 2 The same was in the beginning with God.
- 3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.
- 4 In him was life; and the life was the light of men. 5 And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.
- 6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- 7 The same came for **a witness**, **to** bear witness **of** the Light, that all men through him might believe.
- 8 He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.
- 9 That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.
- 10 He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.
- 11 He came unto his own, and his own received him not.

- 12 But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:
- 13 Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

He said I am the voice of One crying in the wilderness Prepare for the Lord is coming Just as was prophesied by Isaiah

The men had been sent from the Pharisees And asked Then why do you baptize If you are not Christ or Elijah

John said I baptize with water but One of your own you don't know Is the One coming after me that Was chosen before me whose Shoes I'm not worthy to untie among us, (and we <u>beheld</u> his glory, the glory as of the only <u>begotten</u> of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

15 John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake, He that cometh after me is <u>preferred</u> before me: for he <u>was</u> before me.

16 And of his fulness have all we received, and grace for grace.

17 For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.

18 No man hath seen God at any time, the only begotten Son, which is in the \underline{bosom} of the Father, he hath $\underline{declared}$ him.

19 And this is the <u>record</u> of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou?

20 And he **confessed**, and denied not; but confessed, **I** am not the **Christ**.

21 And **they asked** him, What then? **Art thou** <u>Elias</u>? And he saith, I am not. Art thou that prophet? And **he answered**, **No**.

22 Then said they unto him, **Who art thou? that we may give an answer to** them **that sent us**. What sayest thou of thyself?

23 He said, I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, <u>Make straight the way</u> of the Lord, as said the prophet <u>Esaias</u>.

24 And they which were **sent** were of **the Pharisees**. 25 **And** they **asked** him, and said unto him, **Why baptizest thou then, if thou** be **not** that **Christ**, nor **Elias**, neither that prophet?

26 John answered them, saying, I baptize with water: but there standeth one <u>among you</u>, whom ye know not;

27 He it is, who coming after me is <u>preferred</u> before me, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to <u>unloose</u>.

John 1:28

Reference Text

These things took place in Bethabara Across the Jordan River where John had been baptizing

The next day he saw Jesus coming to him And John said Behold the Lamb of God Who takes away the sin of the world

This is He of whom I said After me comes A Man who is preferred and chosen Before me since He's existed Before I was ever born

And I did not know Him but I came to baptize in water so He would be revealed to Israel

And John established the record saying I saw the Spirit descending from heaven Like a dove and it remained on Him and I did not know Him except that He's sent Me to baptize in water like God had said The One on whom you will see the Spirit Descending and remaining there on Him That is Who baptizes with the Holy Spirit

I saw and so testify this is the Son of God

The next day John stood With two of his own disciples Gazing as Jesus walked by them

He said Behold the Lamb of God And the two upon hearing that Turned and followed Jesus

Jesus turned to see them following Then asked What are you looking for They called him Rabbi meaning Master And said We want to see where You stay

He said Come and see So they went with Him and Stayed with Him that day since It was already late in the afternoon 28 These things were done in Bethabara beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing.

29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

30 This is he of whom I said, After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me.

31 And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water.

32 And John <u>bare</u> record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it <u>abode</u> upon him.

33 And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost.

34 And I saw, and <u>bare record</u> that this is the Son of God.

35 Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples;

36 And <u>looking</u> upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!

37 And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

38 Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, What <u>seek</u> ye? They said unto him, Rabbi, (which is to say, being <u>interpreted</u>, Master,) where <u>dwellest</u> thou?

39 **He saith** unto them, **Come and see. They** came and saw where he dwelt, **and** <u>abode</u> with him that day: for it was <u>about the tenth hour</u>.

One of the two who had been following John Was Andrew brother of Simon Peter and so He first went and found his brother Simon Saying that We have found the Messiah Meaning the Christ and Anointed One

And he led his brother to Jesus

Jesus looked over toward him saying You are Simon the son of John yet Like a rock you'll be called Peter

The following day Jesus went to Galilee Then found Philip and said Follow Me

Philip was from the city Bethsaida
The same as Andrew and Peter

Then Philip found Nathanael saying We have found Him of whom Moses Wrote about in the law and prophets Jesus of Nazareth the son of Joseph

Nathanael asked Can any good thing Come out of Nazareth

Philip said to him Come and see

Jesus saw Nathanael coming to Him And said Here is a true Israelite Who has no deceitfulness

Nathanael asked How could You know me Jesus said Before Philip called you I saw you under the fig tree

Nathanael said Rabbi You are the Son of God You are the King of Israel

Jesus said You believe because I said I saw you under the fig tree You'll see greater things than that

40 One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. 41 He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.

42 And he <u>brought</u> him to Jesus. And when Jesus <u>beheld</u> him, he said, Thou art Simon the son of <u>Jona</u>: thou shalt be called <u>Cephas</u>, which is by interpretation, A <u>stone</u>.

43 The day following Jesus would go forth into Galilee, and findeth Philip, and saith unto him, Follow me.

44 Now Philip was of Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.

45 Philip findeth Nathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.

46 And Nathanael said unto him, Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him, Come and see.

47 Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and saith of him, Behold an Israelite <u>indeed</u>, in whom is no <u>quile!</u>

48 Nathanael saith unto him, Whence knowest thou me? Jesus answered and said unto him, Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig tree, I saw thee.

49 Nathanael answered and saith unto him, Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel.

50 Jesus answered and said unto him, Because I said unto thee, I saw thee under the fig tree, believest thou? thou shalt see greater things than these.

I tell you with certainty that You will see heaven open and The angels of God ascending and Also descending upon the Son of man 51 And he saith unto him, <u>Verily</u>, verily, **I** say unto you, Hereafter ye shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man.

JOHN 2

The third day there was a wedding in Cana And the mother of Jesus was there and They invited Jesus and His disciples

And when they wanted more wine Jesus' mother said to Him They have no wine

He said Woman I've nothing to do with you Because My time hasn't quite yet come

His mother said to the servants Do whatever He says to you

There were six large stone water jars Used for ceremonial purifying the Jews Able to hold twenty to thirty gallons each

Jesus said Fill up the jars with water So they filled them all to the brim

He said Draw out some now and Take it to the host of the feast

The host tasted the wine made from water And didn't know where it had come from But all those servants who drew it knew

The host said to the bridegroom
Everyone at the feast's beginning
Sets out the good wine and then as
The guests drink it they set out worse
But you've kept the good wine until now

This was Jesus' beginning of miracles That made His magnificence visible And His disciples believed in Him

JOHN 2

- 1 And the third day there was a <u>marriage</u> in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there: 2 And both Jesus was <u>called</u>, and his disciples, to the
- marriage.

 3 And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus

saith unto him, They have no wine.

- 4 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine <u>hour</u> is not yet <u>come</u>.
- 5 His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.
- 6 And **there were** set there **six water<u>pots</u>** of **stone**, after the <u>manner</u> of the **purifying** of **the Jews**, <u>containing two or three firkins apiece</u>.
- 7 Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. 8 And he saith unto them, Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare it.
- 9 When the <u>ruler</u> of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not <u>whence</u> it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the <u>governor</u> of the feast called the bridegroom, 10 And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now.
- 11 This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.

John 2:12

Reference Text

After that He went down to Capernaum With His mother brothers and disciples Where they stayed for just a few days

The Jewish Passover was coming soon And Jesus went up to Jerusalem and Found in the temple ones who sold Oxen and sheep and doves and Money changers sitting there

Then He made a whip with small cords then Drove them all out of that temple along with The sheep and the oxen and poured out all Changers' money and overturned all tables And said to those who'd been selling doves Take all these out of here and do not make My Father's house a house of merchandise

His disciples remembered it was written Zeal for Your house did consume Me

Then the Jews questioned Him What sign do You show us By doing these things

Jesus said Destroy this temple and In three days I'll raise it up again

They said It took forty six years To build this temple and so how Could You rebuild it in three days

But He spoke of the temple of His body And so when He was risen from the dead His disciples remembered He had said this And believed the scriptures and these words

When Jesus was in Jerusalem
At the Passover on the feast day
Many believed He was the Messiah
When they saw Him do all the miracles

But Jesus did not entrust Himself to them For He knew all men and did not need Any to tell Him about human nature 12 After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his <u>brethren</u>, and his disciples: and they <u>continued</u> there <u>not many</u> days.

 $13\ \mbox{And}$ the Jews' passover was $\underline{\mbox{at hand}},$ and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

14 And found in the temple those that sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the changers of money sitting:

15 And when he had made a <u>scourge</u> of small cords, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the tables;

16 And said unto them that sold doves, Take these things hence; make not my Father's house an house of merchandise.

17 And his disciples remembered that it was written, The zeal of thine house hath <u>eaten</u> me up.

18 Then answered the Jews and said unto him, What sign shewest thou unto us, seeing that thou doest these things?

19 Jesus answered and said unto them, Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.

20 Then said the Jews, Forty and six years was this temple in building, and wilt thou <u>rear</u> it up in three days?

21 But he spake of the temple of his body.

22 When therefore he was risen from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this unto them; and they believed the scripture, and the word which Jesus had said.

23 Now when he was in Jerusalem at the passover, in the feast day, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did.

24 But Jesus did not <u>commit</u> himself unto them, because he knew all men,

25 And needed not that any should testify of man:

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus Who was one of the rulers of the Jews That came to Jesus at night saying Rabbi we know You're a teacher Who has come from God for No man can do miracles Which You do except If God is with him

Jesus said Truly except one is born again They cannot see the kingdom of God

Nicodemus said How can anyone Be born when they are already old As they cannot go for a second time Into their mother's womb and be born

Jesus said The truth is unless a person Is born of water and of the Spirit They cannot enter in the Kingdom of God

That which is born of the flesh is flesh And what is born of the Spirit is spirit

Don't be amazed that I told you That you must be born again

For the wind blows where it will And although you hear its sound You can't tell where it comes from And you cannot tell where it's going And so are the ones born of the Spirit

Nicodemus asked How can these things be Jesus said Are you a teacher of Israel Yet you don't know these things

We speak the truth about what we know And testify to you about what we've seen And still you won't receive our eyewitness

- 1 There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews:
- 2 The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, we know that thou art a teacher come from God: for no man can do these miracles that thou doest, except God be with him.
- 3 **Jesus** answered and **said** unto him, **Verily**, verily, I say unto thee, **Except** a man be **born again**, he **cannot see the kingdom of God**.

- 4 Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?
- 5 **Jesus** answered, **Verily**, verily, I say unto thee, **Except** a man be **born of water and of the Spirit**, he **cannot enter in**to **the kingdom of God**.
- 6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

- 7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.
- 8 The wind bloweth where it <u>listeth</u>, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell <u>whence</u> it cometh, and <u>whither</u> it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.
- 9 Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can these things be?
- 10 Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?

 11 <u>Verily</u>, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness.

If I have told you earthly things which You don't believe then how would you Believe if I told you the heavenly things

And no man has ascended up to heaven Except He that came down from heaven As did the Son of man who is of heaven

As Moses lifted up the serpent In the wilderness likewise must The Son of man be lifted up also And that whoever believes in Him Will not perish but have eternal life

For God so loved this world That He gave His only Son So all who believe in Him Would not die but rather Obtain everlasting life

For God did not send His Son Into the world to condemn But to save the world Through His Son

One that believes in Him is not condemned But an unbeliever is condemned already Because they chose not to believe in The name of the only Son of God

Then this is the condemnation
Light has come into the world and
Men loved darkness rather than Light
Because their deeds were evil in the dark

For every one that does evil Hates the Light and will not Come toward the Light lest Their actions are accused

But one who acts in truth
Comes to the Light in order
That their deeds are exposed
To make sure their work is God's

12 If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?

13 And no man hath ascended up to heaven, <u>but</u> he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is <u>in</u> heaven.

14 And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up:

15 That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life.

16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but <u>have</u> everlasting life.

17 For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.

18 He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he <u>hath</u> not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

19 And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. 20 For every one that doeth evil hateth the light,

neither **cometh to the light, lest** his <u>deeds</u> should be <u>reproved</u>.

21 **But** he that <u>doeth</u> truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made <u>manifest</u>, that they are <u>wrought</u> in **God**.

Jesus knew that Pharisees heard That He'd made and baptized More disciples than John So He left Judea and Headed to Galilee

But Jesus Himself did not baptize For His disciples did the baptisms

He needed to go through Samaria and Came into one of its cities called Sychar Near the land Jacob gave his son Joseph

Jacob's well was there so then Jesus Wearied with His journey sat there And it was about the noon hour

His disciples went to buy food and A Samaritan woman came there To draw water and Jesus said Give Me something to drink

The woman said How is it that as a Jew You ask me a Samaritan for a drink as The Jews want nothing to do with us

Jesus said If you knew the gift of God and

his seal that God is true.

34 For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth <u>not</u> the Spirit by <u>measure</u> unto him.

35 The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand.

36 He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not <u>see</u> life; but the <u>wrath</u> of God <u>abideth on</u> him.

- 1 When therefore the Lord **knew** how the **Pharisees** had **heard that** Jesus **made** and **baptized more disciples than John**,
- 2 (Though Jesus himself baptized not, but his disciples,)
- 3 **He left Judaea, and** departed again into **Galilee**.
- 4 And he must needs go through Samaria.
- 5 Then **cometh** he **to** a **city** of Samaria, which is **called Sychar, near** to **the** parcel of **ground** that **Jacob gave** to **his son Joseph**.
- 6 Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied with his journey, sat thus on the well: and it was about the <u>sixth</u> hour.

Who it is that tells you Give Me a drink You would have asked of Him then He would give you Living Water

She said Sir you've nothing to draw with And the well is deep so from where Do You get this Living Water

Are You greater than our father Jacob Who gave us the well and drank of it With all of his children and his cattle

Jesus said Whoever drinks of this water They will be thirsty once again but Whoever drinks of the water That I will give to them Will never thirst

But the water that I will give them Will be in them like a well of water That springs up into everlasting life

The woman said Sir give me this water So that I will not be thirsty again nor Have to get my water here again He said Go call your husband And then come return here

She said I have no husband Jesus said You are right since You have had five husbands and Him you are with isn't your husband And so in that you've spoken truthfully

She said Sir I perceive You are a prophet Our fathers worshipped in this mountain And you say in Jerusalem is the place Where all the people should worship

Jesus said Woman believe Me An hour is coming when you Will not worship the Father Neither in this mountain Or even at Jerusalem

You worship what you do not know

thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water. 11 The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water?

12 Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle?

13 Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again:
14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.

15 The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw.

16 Jesus saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither.

18 For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly.

19 The woman **saith** unto him, **Sir, I perceive** that **thou art a prophet**.

20 Our fathers worshipped in this mountain; and ye say, that in Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship.

21 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, the hour cometh, when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship the Father

But He said I have food to eat That you don't know about

Therefore the disciples said to one another Has anyone brought Him anything to eat

Jesus said My food is to do The will of Him that sent Me To completely finish His work

You say There are still four months Before the harvest will come and I say Lift up your eyes and look out at the fields we worship: for salvation is of the Jews.

23 But the <u>hour</u> cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him.

24 God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.

25 The woman saith unto him, **I know that Messias cometh**, which is called Christ: **when he** is come, **he will tell us all things**.

26 Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he.

27 And <u>upon this</u> came his disciples, and marvelled that he talked with the woman: yet no man said, What seekest thou? or, Why talkest thou with her? 28 The woman then left her water<u>pot</u>, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men, 29 Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: <u>is not this</u> the Christ? 30 Then they went out of the city, and came unto him

31 In the mean while his disciples prayed him, saying, <u>Master</u>, eat.

32 **But he said** unto them, **I have <u>meat</u> to eat that ye know not** of.

33 Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought him ought to eat?
34 Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work.

35 Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white

Anyone who harvests receives wages And gathers up fruit for eternal life So the planter and harvester as One sows and another reaps May both rejoice together

36 And he that <u>reapeth</u> receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that <u>soweth</u> and he that <u>reapeth</u> may rejoice together. 37 And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth.

38 I sent you to <u>reap</u> that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours.

39 And many of the Samaritans of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified, He told me all that ever I did.

40 So when the Samaritans were come unto him, they <u>besought</u> him that he would <u>tarry</u> with them: and he <u>abode</u> there two days.

41 And many more believed because of his own word; 42 And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard him ourselves, and know that this is <u>indeed</u> the Christ, the Saviour of the world.

43 Now after two days he departed thence, and went into **Galilee**.

44 For **Jesus** himself testified, that a prophet hath no honour in his own country.

The invalid man replied Sir I have no man To help me when the water is stirred But while I am going someone Steps down in before me 49 The nobleman saith unto him, Sir, come down ere my child die.

50 Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way.

51 And as he was now going down, his servants met him, and told him, saying, Thy son liveth.

52 Then <u>enquired</u> he of them the hour when he began to <u>amend</u>. And they said unto him, Yesterday at the <u>seventh</u> hour the fever left him.

53 So the father knew that it was at the same hour, in the which Jesus said unto him, Thy son liveth: and himself believed, and his whole house.

- 9 **And immediately the man was made whole,** and took up his bed, and walked: and **on** the same day was the **sabbath**.
- 10 The Jews therefore said unto him that was cured, It is the sabbath day: it is not lawful for thee to carry thy bed.
- 11 **He** answered them, He **that made me whole**, the same **said** un**to me**, **Take up thy bed**, **and walk**. 12 **Then asked they him**, What **man is that** which said unto thee, Take up thy bed, and walk?
